Middle / High School Wisconsin State testing update

The Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction has informed school districts to begin planning for in-person testing for the 2020-2021 school year; this includes schools whose current instruction is hybrid, in-person, or 100% virtual.

Here at Williams Bay Middle and High Schools, we have started the process to begin planning to safely provide an in-person, school proctored testing environment for all of our students, whether they are in-person or remote learners. Remote (virtual) testing options are not available for statewide assessments.

In general, the assessment(s) measure the knowledge and skills that student(s) should have acquired by the time they reach each grade level. The results of these assessments will be used to help school staff make determinations or placements to best support our students.

- 1. Forward exams assess the following areas/grade levels:
 - Grades 3-8 in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics Grades 4 and 8 in science and, Grades 4, 8, and 10 in social studies.
- The ACT test (11th grade) covers four academic skill areas: English, 2. mathematics, reading, and scientific reasoning. It also offers an optional direct writing test.
- 3. The Aspire test (9/10th grade) assesses students' readiness in five areas covered by the ACT test: English, math, reading, science and writing.

has begun the process to submit an Ancient Native American Burial Site in Williams Bay to the Wisconsin State Burial Site Registry. The students have undertaken this process to preserve and protect the site from any sort of disturbance.

Several weeks ago, History Club students sent a proposal to receive permission to proceed from the Forest County Potawatomi People, the owners of the property that contains the burial ground. The site is a burial ground of not only Chief Big Foot's two wives and children, but of even earlier Oneida Mound Builder People. Once permission is received, the students begin the task of researching the property and filling out the required paperwork to place the site on the registry.

The registry is a service of the Wisconsin State Historical Society's Burial Preservation Commission that provides the service to local, state, and private contractors, landscapers, and others who may be unaware of the existence of a burial site.

Elementary Wisconsin Forward Assessment

The Wisconsin Forward Exam is designed to gauge how all students are doing in relation to the Wisconsin Academic Standards. These standards outline what students should know and be able to do in order to be college-career ready. The Forward Exam is administered online in the spring of each school year at:

Grades 3-8 in English language arts (ELA) and mathematics

Grades 4 and 8 in science and,

Grades 4, 8, and 10 in social studies.

Williams Bay Elementary School students in grades 3-5 will participate in these assessments between April 12-23. Students in grades 3-5 who are participating in our distance learning program are expected to take these assessments in-person as well. We will provide a safe and secure testing environment for these students with a reasonable testing schedule.

We have been working with students to prepare for these assessments using testtaking strategies for content areas as well as social-emotional strategies. Teachers have also been working with students using test preparation booklets to help students become familiar with the types of vocabulary and questions they will experience when taking these assessments.

We take all assessments very seriously. Results provide information about student performance, allowing teachers to target instruction to student needs. Assessment results also enable teachers to reflect upon their own instructional practices. Students, administrators, and parents also gain valuable information that provides a better understanding of what students know and what we can do to support and assist them. Sample or practice test questions can be found at http://dpi.wi.gov/assessment/forward/ sample-items. There is also an online tools training that will be available for students in mid to late February and is intended to give students the opportunity to practice with the tools available on the Forward Exam. More information regarding the Wisconsin Forward Exam will be shared with families in the near future through the weekly Bulldog Nibbles.
